

Firearm Homicide in New Jersey

- Six of every 10 gun deaths (61%) in New Jersey are homicides.
- The majority of homicides (75%) in New Jersey are committed with firearms.
- 89% of firearm homicide victims are male; and 78% are Black.




New Jersey Firearm Homicide Rate, 2007-2016


2008-2014, New Jersey Death Rates per 100,000 Population
