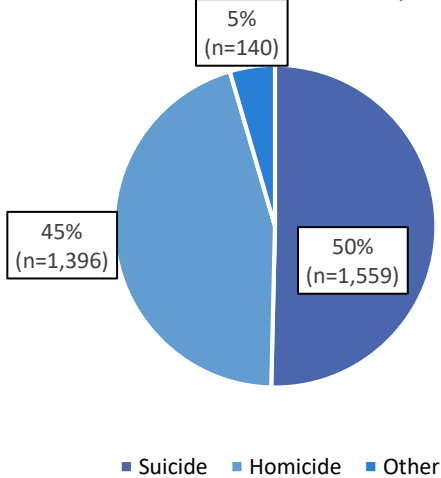


Firearm Suicide in California

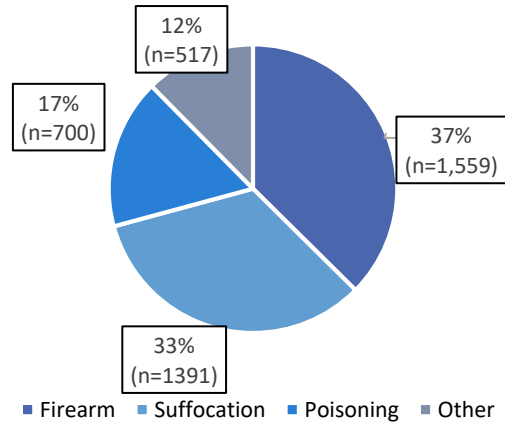
- Half of all gun deaths in California are suicides.
- Firearm is the most lethal mean of suicide and 37% of all suicides are by firearm in California.
- 90% of people who die by firearm suicide in California are male; and 91% are White.

Gun Deaths in California, 2015



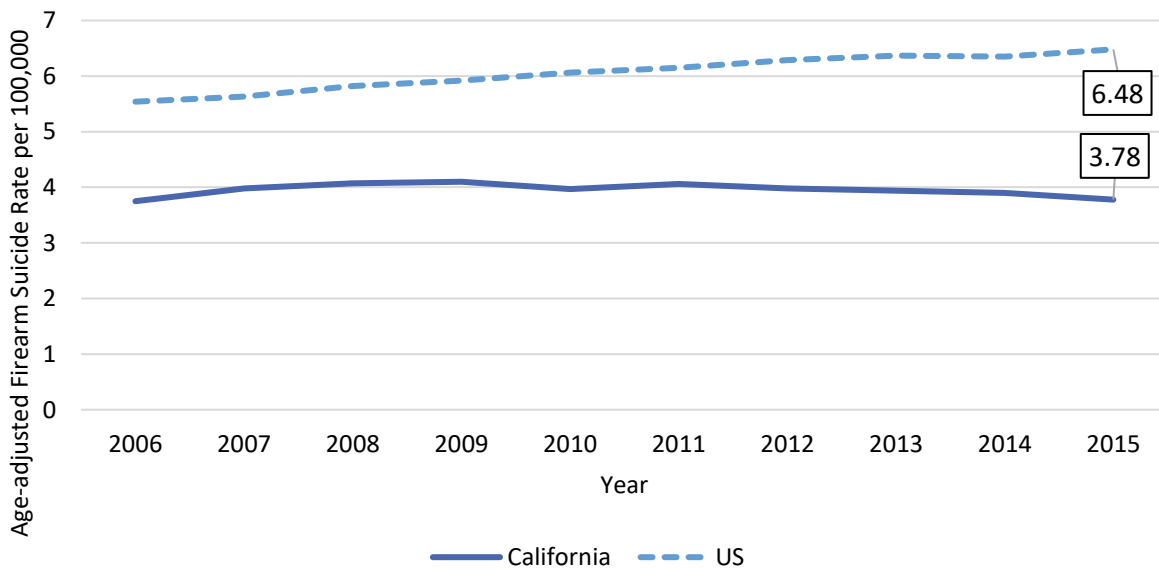
Total Gun Deaths in 2015: 3,095

Suicide Deaths in California, 2015



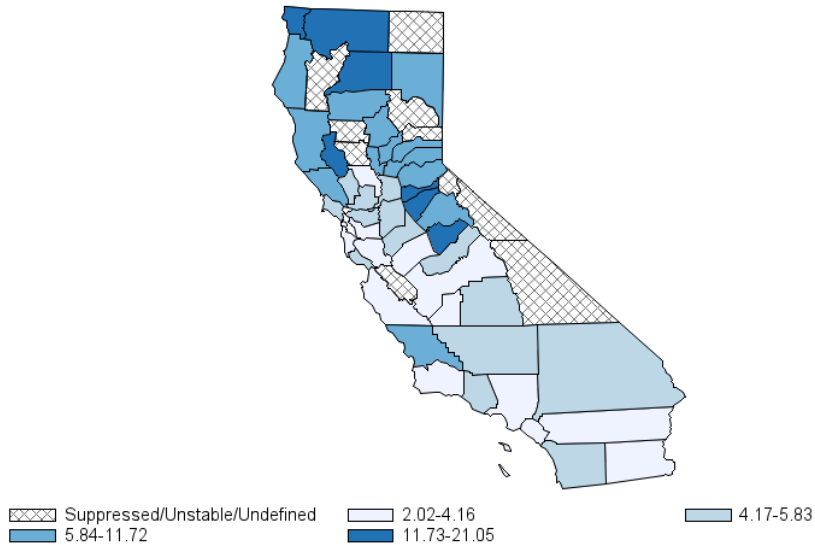
Total Suicide Deaths in 2015: 4,167

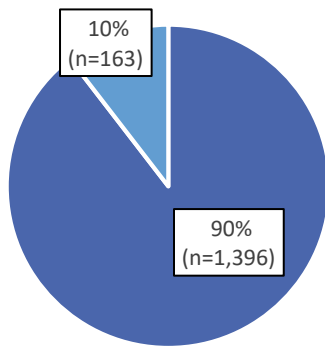

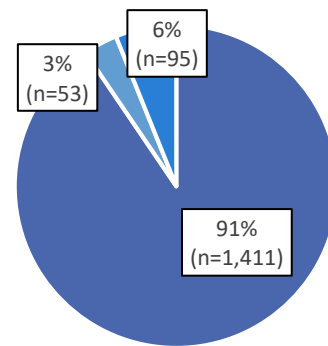
