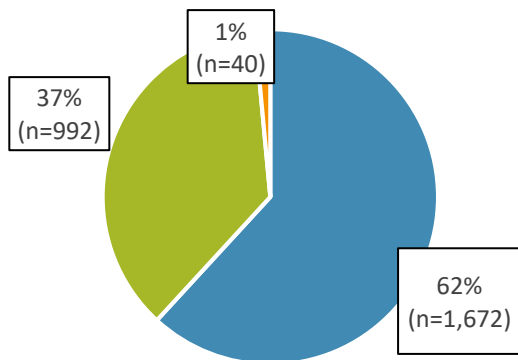


Firearm Suicide in Florida

- Almost two-thirds (62%) of all gun deaths in Florida are suicides.
- More than half of all suicides (53%) in Florida are by firearm.
- The firearm suicide rate in Florida has increased 11% over the last decade.
- 83% of people who die by firearm suicide in Florida are male; and 93% are White.

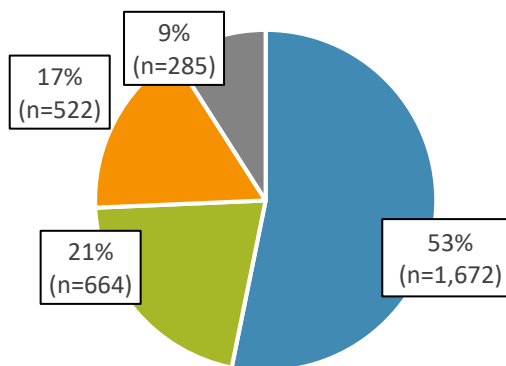
Gun Deaths in Florida, 2016

Total Gun Deaths in 2016: 2,704

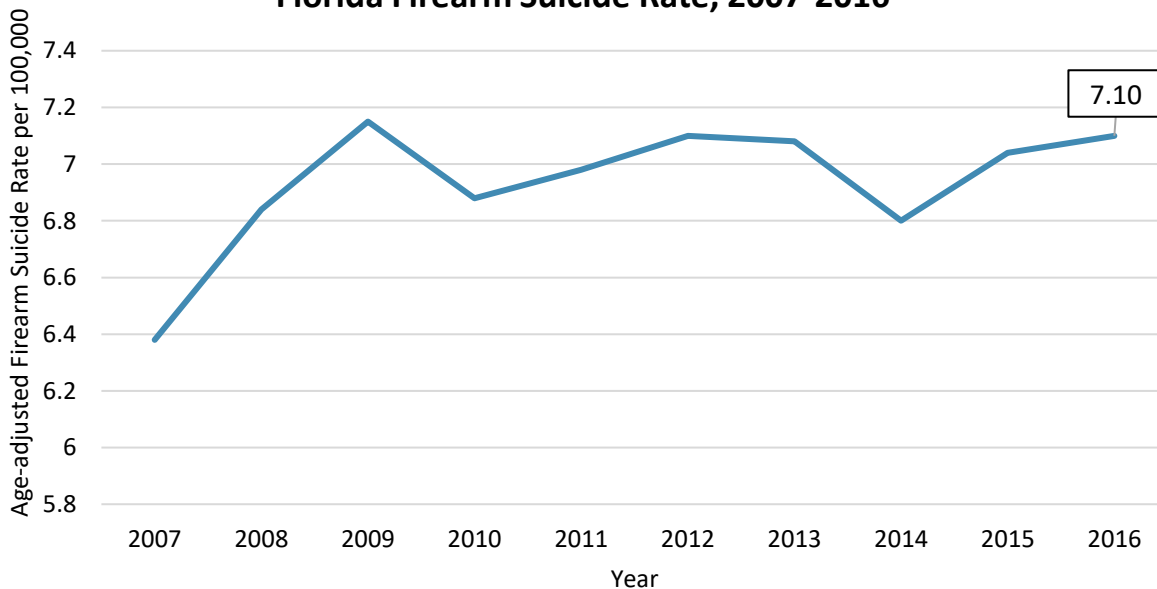
Suicide Deaths in Florida, 2016

■ Poisoning ■ Other

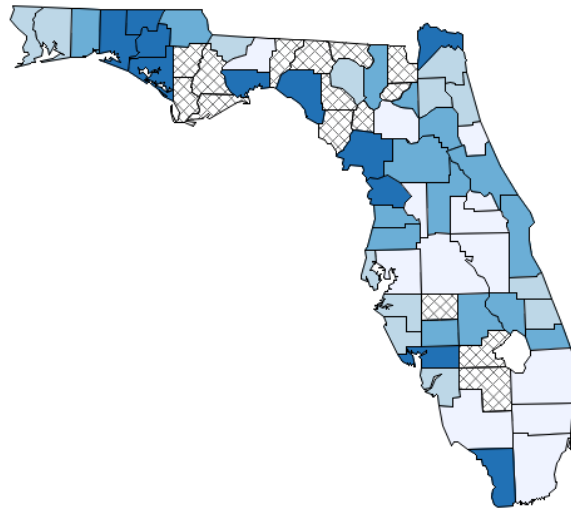

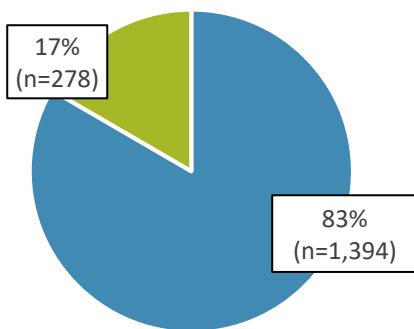

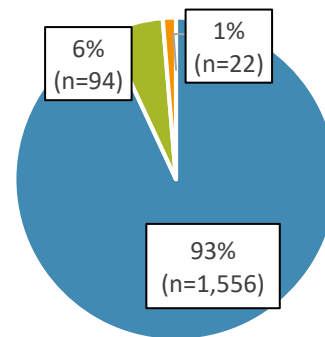
