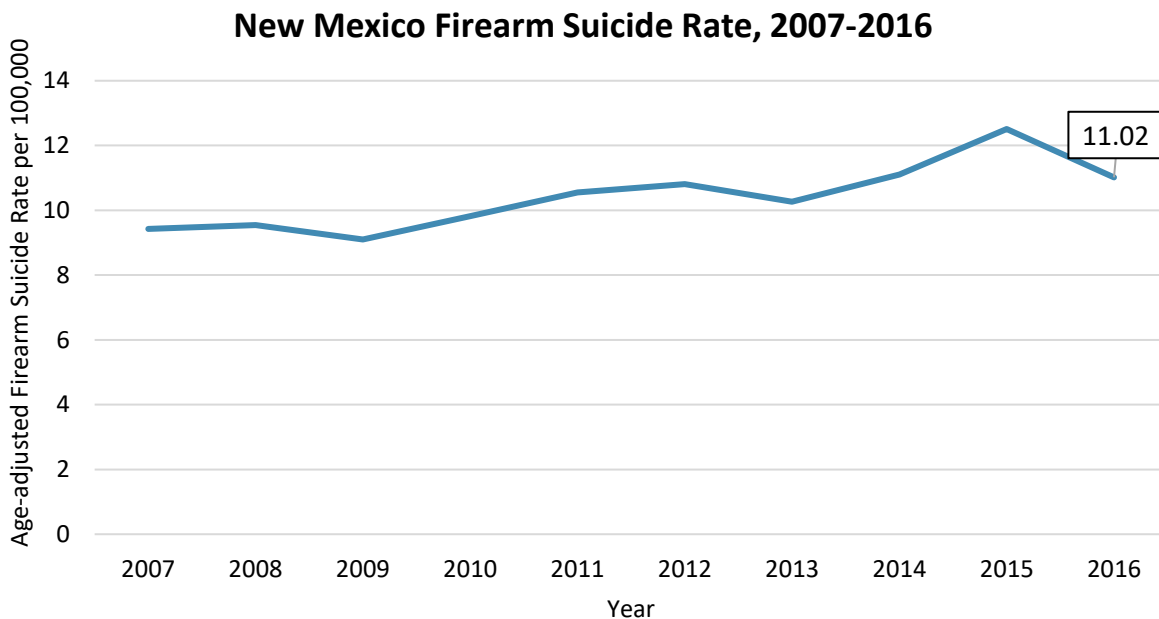
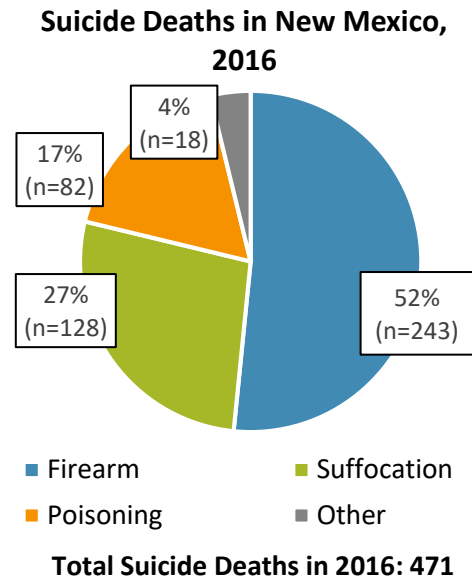
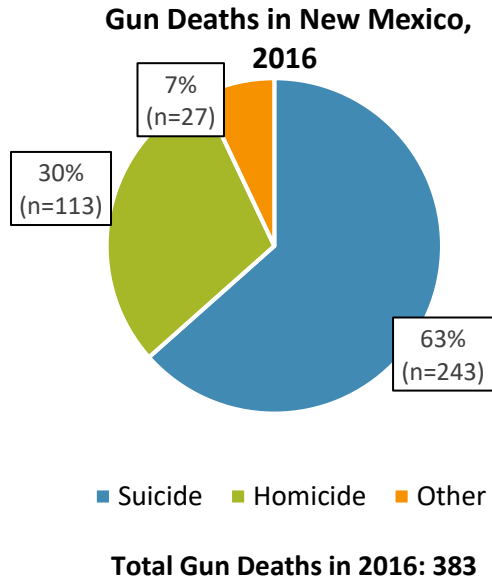


Firearm Suicide in New Mexico

- Nearly two-thirds (63%) of all gun deaths in New Mexico are suicides.
- Approximately half (52%) of all suicides in New Mexico are by firearm.
- The firearm suicide rate in New Mexico has increased 17% over the last decade.
- 84% of people who die by firearm suicide in New Mexico are male; and 95% are White.



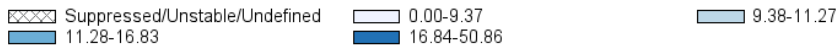
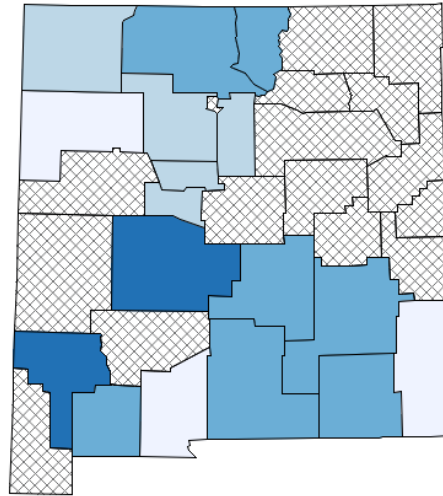
Firearm Suicide in New Mexico – Demographic Information

Annualized Crude Rate for New Mexico: 10.44

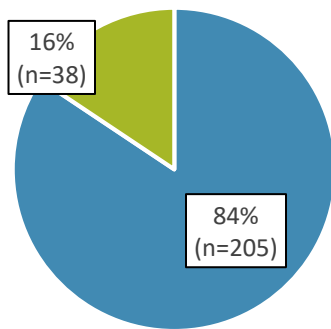

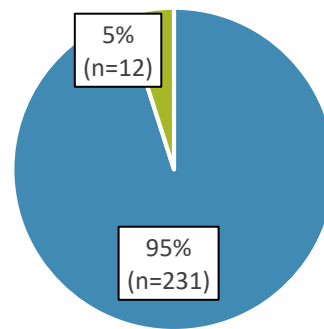
