




Firearm Suicide in Pennsylvania

- Nearly two-thirds (63%) of all gun deaths in Pennsylvania are suicides.
- Half of all suicides in Pennsylvania are by firearm.
- The firearm suicide rate in Pennsylvania has increased 30% over the last decade.
- 88% of people who die by firearm suicide in Pennsylvania are male; and 90% are White.






Total Gun Deaths in 2016: 1,555 Total Suicide Deaths in 2016: 1,970

2008-2014, Pennsylvania Death Rates per 100,000 Population




