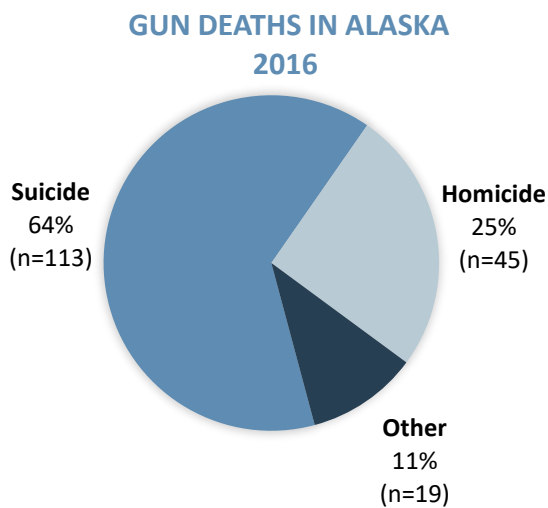
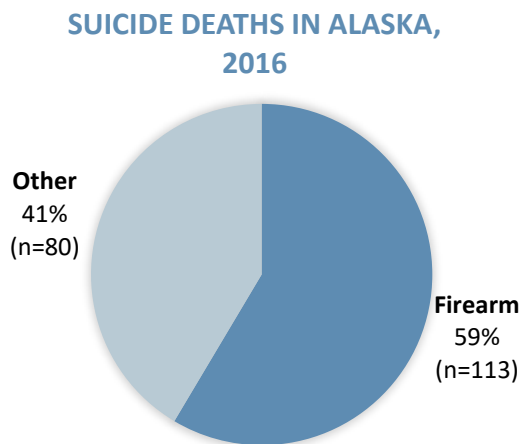


FIREARM SUICIDE IN ALASKA

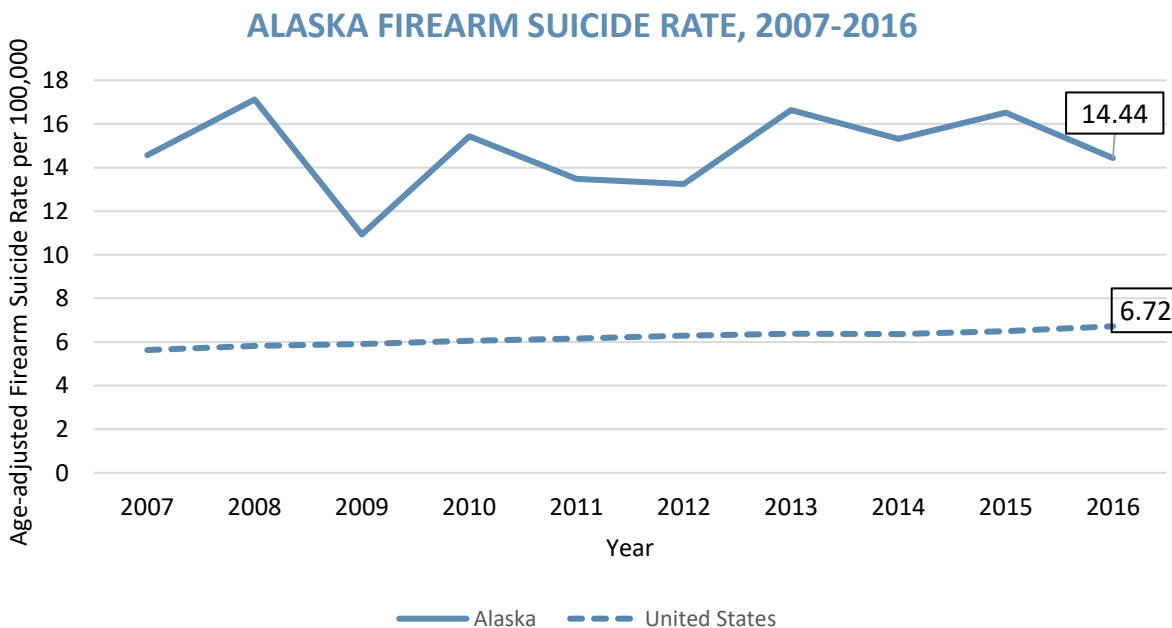
- Nearly two-thirds (64%) of all gun deaths in Alaska are suicides.
- Three out of every five suicides (59%) in Alaska are by firearm.
- The firearm suicide rate in Alaska has increased 32% since 2009.
- Eighty-five percent of people who die by firearm suicide in Alaska are male; and 65% are White.



Total Gun Deaths in 2016: 177

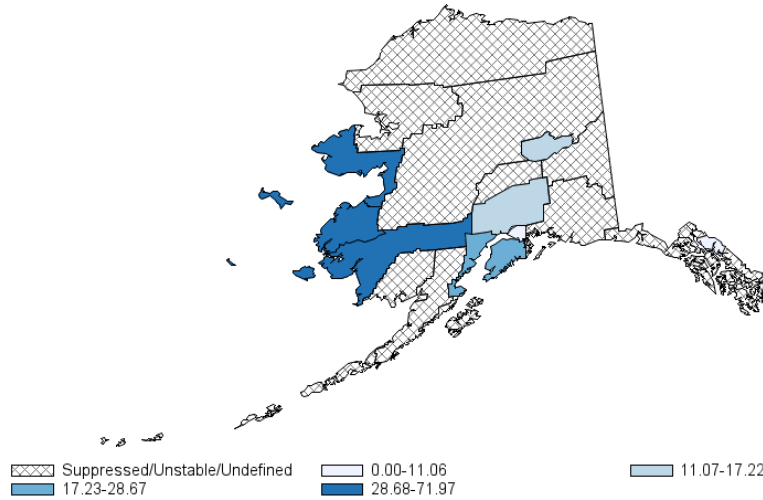


Total Suicide Deaths in 2016: 193

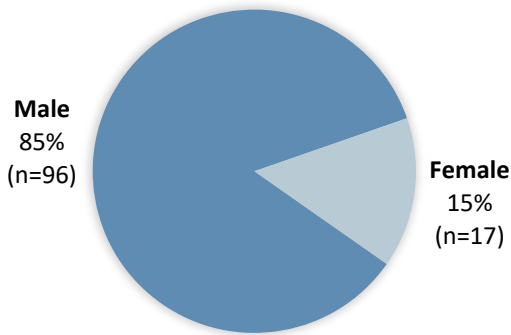

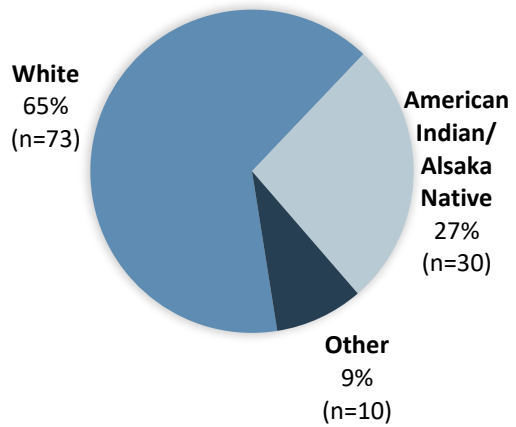
